

2026 Art Submission Rules

Traditional Art Entries:

The entry divisions for traditional art forms are as follows:

- 1) Primary Art Grades 1-3
- 2) Elementary Art Grades 4-5
- 3) Middle School Art Grades 6-8
- 4) **Senior High Art** Grades 9-12

General Rules covering Traditional Art:

- The art must be original to the student. Do not copy someone else's work. We are aware that copying the masters is somewhat a category and has value for instructional purposes, but we are not considering that category. An artist statement must be signed along with the entry, stating, among other things, that the artwork is original to the student.
- 2) All entrants must sign an entry form. This form, as well as an artist statement form will be available before the competition. It must be filled out and ready when you drop off art so that there is sufficient time to judge the art.
- 3) Art must have been completed within the 12 months prior to entry.
- 4) No art may be entered that was done under direct supervision of a teacher or parent. The student may use help such as reference books and so on but is not allowed to request direct suggestions from others in how to change their art for improvement for the sake of this competition. The student needs to rely on what he has learned to put forth his best effort for the competition. (Exception: Elementary students may have parent or teacher guidance and suggestions, but the supervisor should in no way touch the student's work.)
- 5) **Photo reference** *is* **allowed.** Be aware that cameras lie due to lens distortion and other limitations; just because a student uses a photograph does not mean he will have an unfair advantage. In fact, the student should be aware that following a photograph too closely could handicap his entry if the photograph suffers from much lens distortion.
- 6) **All traditional art must be framed.** This is part of the presentation of traditional art. It may be matted within the frame if so desired.
- 7) If a parent or teacher deems the student sufficiently advanced, **students may compete in a level higher than the grade division describes**. However, be aware that this is likely to make the competition for that student significantly more difficult.
- 8) The following art may be realistic/representational or abstract. If enough of each is entered, we may divide categories into Abstract/Non-Abstract divisions and award accordingly.
- 9) Entries are limited to two-dimensional art only.
- 10) There is no limit to the number of entries a student may submit in any one category, provided that all the work has been completed within the calendar year of March 2025-March 2026.
